

SOUTH WARD SCHOOL MUSEUM PROJECT UPDATE

The 2015 summer got off to a great start with the appropriation of over \$200,000 by the Florida Legislature towards this project. Our local legislators were very supportive, especially Senator Jack Latvala. Endorsements from Clearwater City Council and many individuals were very helpful in achieving the legislative appropriation. The veto by Governor Scott of this and many other line items in the budget ended the state funding for this year.

With indications of help from many sources, Clearwater Historical Society has been encouraged to try again this next legislative session for funding. The handouts containing the goals, benefits, and purpose, as well as the needs of this project are now being revised for more contacts with legislators, the Governor, local governments, and individual supporters. Suggestions and help with this campaign are most welcome.

Because of the many possible uses and ADA accessibility, a high priority has been given to restoring Building 3, the former cafeteria, kindergarten/preschool, and media center. A contractor/builder and his roofer was engaged last year. An architect, with input from a structural engineer has prepared several sets of drawings for this project that have yet to be fully accepted by permitting officials at Pinellas County Schools. After September meetings with all of these parties at school offices and at the project site, it appears that issues are in the process of being resolved and permitting is forth-coming as early as October. Suggestions from the architect for solutions to ADA access to Buildings 1 and 2 were also examined at the on site meeting. Elevator/lift representatives have also given input on this issue.

With help from Pinellas County Schools and a significant donation by the Palm Pavilion and Hamilton family, the unexpected high cost of utilities, especially storm water fees, at the site that was the subject of a recent newspaper article have been resolved.

CITY OF CLEARWATER TO HELP WITH FUNDING TO CHS

The City of Clearwater will take a larger part in Clearwater history by providing some funding for the activities of its official partner, the Clearwater Historical Society. At a recent meeting with city staff, CHS was informed of the intent of City Council to provide some financial support to CHS as soon as an agreement can be developed that is satisfactory to all parties. This support would begin in the new city budget year beginning October 1, 2015. CHS is looking forward to more closely working with the City of Clearwater to identify, preserve and disseminate Clearwater's history.

Now we need your help to restore these buildings to their former selves, before it is too late. With the loss of so many historic structures in Clearwater over the years, this project is a chance to save a significant part of our heritage and return a facility to public use. With your support, the buildings will be brought up to code, refurbished and turned into a museum and community center where locals and visitors alike can engage in Pinellas County's past and continue the legacy of learning once more. Visitors will also be able to witness the history of the Clearwater Bombers, the 10 time world champion men's fast pitch softball team that put Clearwater on the map. Your help is critical to our preservation effort and giving the South Ward School new and lasting life so that future generations can connect with their past. On June 24, the Big Fire of 1910 destroyed the entire business block on the north side of Cleveland Street, between Fort Harrison and Osceola Avenues. The burned buildings were replaced as brick 2 story buildings, most of which also burned in the 1960's or 70's. They were again rebuilt as 1 story buildings that remain today.
