Gone but not Forgotten

CHS assisted the Clearwater Heights Reunion Committee in locating the site of the St. Mathew's Cemetery, an African American Cemetery, c.1909 – 1940's, at the Frank Crum property, Missouri Ave. and Cleveland St. Muhammad Abdur-Rahim and Barbara Sorey-Love spearheaded the investigation based on personal memories. Ground Penetrating Radar (GPR) revealed 70 possible grave sites at St. Mathew's Cemetery site and more outside the fence to be surveyed. On August 17 the Clearwater Upper Pinellas Branch of the NAACP presented the findings for this site along with the North Greenwood Cemetery. The North Greenwood Cemetery, surveyed by Cardno Construction Company found 54 possible grave sites. The next step, ground truthing, involves removal of layers of soil in very thin layers to verify what the GPR findings and needs approval from Frank Crum company and Pinellas County Schools to proceed.
