Joe Turner: A Clearwater Legend

Joe Turner, long-time member and supporter of the Clearwater Historical Society passed away March 11, 2022. Remembered as the master of the Society's Annual Fish Fry, he was a part of the pioneer Turner family that settled in Clearwater in the 1850's.

A graduate of Clearwater High School in 1950, Joe joined the Marine Corps and was an expert rifleman. He was awarded four battle stars on his Korean Service Ribbon, and a Presidential Unit Citation. Returning from Korea, he worked at Turner Printing Company, a family business started by his father, former Clearwater Mayor, Joseph K. Turner Sr. in 1933.

He will be missed at the May 7, 2022 Annual Fish Fry, to be named *The Joe Turner Memorial Fish Fry*

FOUNDING FAMILIES OF CLEARWATER

Most know what brings people to Clearwater today. The temperate climate, the beautiful beach, proximity to Orlando attractions, and lower state taxes are certainly factors. But what initially brought people to the wild, unsettled, and unexplored Clearwater? Where did they come from.? What did they do once they arrived in what was an untamed wilderness? How did they survive? Clearwater Historical Society's next exhibit, Founding Families of Clearwater-An Exhibit of the early settlers of Clear Water Harbor, explores those questions.

Opening to the public on June 3, this exhibit features many of the homesteading families that came to this area and through their bravery, sacrifices and pioneering spirit, laid much of the groundwork upon which our beautiful town was built. To this day, streets, parks, schools, and buildings bear many of their names.
