

Clearwater Honors the Coast Guard

The Society started the new year with a Salute to the Coast Guard telling the history of the Clearwater Air Station and the Coast Guard Station Sand Key. The local Auxiliary helped with the history of the many units in the area.

One Saturday the family of Coast Guard Captain Robert Whitley, the second Commander at the Clearwater Air Station, visited the museum specifically to view the Coast Guard exhibit and for his family to record some of his memories of his more than 31 years in the Coast Guard. His career both started in and ended in Clearwater. In the 1950s he began his career with the Coast Guard at the St. Pete Station at Albert Whitted Field before the Air Station moved to Clearwater. He worked as a pilot of many types of Coast Guard aircraft but from listening to him talk the C-130 was his favorite. He told stories of a search and rescue mission where he flew a C-130 under the Golden Gate Bridge. Closer to us he worked on the planning for the recovery of the USCGC Blackthorn after the collision near the Skyway Bridge. The family was kind enough to share the video to our Clearwater Historical Society Events channel on YouTube.

Wallace Family Celebrate 150 Years in Clearwater

The Wallace Family, originally from North Carolina, traveled by small schooner from Mobile, Alabama for the 5 day trip, along with the Drew and Pierce Families to Clearwater in 1873. Landing at the foot of Cleveland Street with a years' worth supply of for all three families. The second year the family homesteaded 120 acres. The family grew Sea Island cotton then vegetables until their citrus produced which took 10 years. Bill Wallace Jr., the past president of the Clearwater Historical Society, still lives on 20 acres of land purchased in 1905. Him and his brother donated some family artifacts to the museum to commemorate the 150th anniversary of the family's arrival in Clearwater.


Signal Boxes Find New Purpose



In 2017 the Clearwater Art Alliance and the Public Art and

Design Board started a program to decorate signal boxes at intersections throughout the city with art work related to the stories of Clearwater. Many of the signal boxes around the city are in need of an upgrade, according to FDOT which works out great for the museum. The signal box, that was located at Drew St and Betty Lane, celebrating the 100th Anniversary of the Clearwater Country Club. We also received the box that was located at the corner of Cleveland and Myrtle celebrating history of Jazz in the city, with artwork by Tim Boatright (the artist that designed our mural) Looking for a way to recycle and find a new use for the boxes, CAA and the City donated the boxes to the museum. 

Facade Bricks being replaced

Last July a portion of the brick facade fell from the third floor/south side of the 1912 high school building due to age and moisture. This winter the Pinellas County School Board brick mason came out and replaced the fallen bricks from the façade. One of the problems is the moisture inside the building needs to be removed. It is going to take a few industrial size dehumidifiers to remove the moisture that will help stabilize the building. We have applied for grants to purchase the dehumidifiers.

The School Board also replaced part of the shingles on the old teacher's lounge building. We greatly appreciate their partnership in keeping up these treasured buildings.
