BELLEVIEW-BILTMORE HOTEL Exhibition

The "White Queen of the Gulf" with its shining white paint and green shingle roof was not always painted white. This is just one of the many discoveries in the CELEBRATING THE BELLEVIEW BILTMORE HOTEL EXHIBITION. The exhibition came together with help and encouragement from Joey Vars, Historian and Sandi Hill, Belleview Inn, along with Clearwater Historical Society all volunteers Built by railroad tycoon Henry B. Plant in 1897 the Belleview-Biltmore Hotel once stood 350,000 square feet and served as a grand resort, one time lodging for WWII servicemen, and destination for the first-time tourists to Florida's west coast. Over a century of guests entered its doors and continue today in the present day 35 room Belleview Inn opened in 2018.

Many thanks to the Belleview Inn staff and JMC Development President, J. Michael Cheezem, for making this first time exhibit and opening a grand event.




Making a Difference:

Research Volunteers uncover local history

Research volunteers received a request from a woman looking for a picture of her sister who had no photos from her childhood. She remembered "a red brick school" so it was presumed she attended North Ward Elementary. From the year she was born, we found two possible classes and sent her two childhood digital photos,

Clearwater parks sought information for potential markers in city parks. Volunteers identified four previous bandshells (1925, 1957, 1967, and 1983) as it prepared to open The Sound at Coachman Park.

Clearwater Historical Society charges \$25 per hour for non-members requesting research assistance and provides members two simple research queries per year.
